

## Child care is now more affordable for more families

Making early childhood education and care more affordable has benefits for many children and their families, communities and the Australian economy.

## What you need to know



The income limit is increasing to \$530,000 a year.



Families earning \$80,000 or less will get **90% subsidy**.



Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can get a higher rate of Child Care Subsidy for one or more of their children.



Families with
Aboriginal and/or
Torres Strait Islander
children can get at
least 36 hours of
subsidised care per
fortnight per child.

## What you need to do

If you already get Child Care Subsidy, you don't need to do anything.
Services Australia will apply these changes for you.
